Paris World Games, France and Partille Cup, Sweden

Vedant was a key member of the 14-player Indian contingent in the Boys U-18 category and impressed everyone with his remarkable performance. He was awarded the "Man of the Match" in the game against AS Pagny Handball (France), showcasing his exceptional skill and sportsmanship on an international platform.

Adding to this exceptional achievement, Vedant also represented India at the prestigious Partille Cup 2025, widely known as the Partille World Cup, held in Gothenburg (Heden area), Sweden from 30 June to 05 July 2025. This tournament is renowned as the world's largest and most international youth handball event, featuring over 1,400 teams from nearly 50 countries, including Croatia, Egypt, Estonia, Faeroes, Finland, Iceland, Lithuania, Netherlands, Poland, and Spain.

We are equally proud to share that Mr. Govind Shinde, our school's Handball Coach, served as the coach of the Indian team for both these international tournaments, playing a pivotal role in mentoring the young athletes.

Vedant's journey of excellence also includes his participation in the 67th SGFI National School Games Handball Competition 2023-24 and 47th HFI Junior Boy's National Handball Championship, New Delhi, where he was part of the Madhya Pradesh team that clinched the Gold and Bronze medal respectively.

India Creates History at World Schools Debating Championship, Panama

It is a moment of immense pride for the nation, the state, and our city as India clinched the World Schools Debating Championship (WSDC) 2025 for the second time in history.

Adding to the glory, two Emeralites — Manveer Pratap Rathore of Class XI and alumna Avni Kaur Chadha (Batch of 2025) were integral members of the five-member India Debating Team.

The championship, held in Panama, saw India deliver a stellar performance, culminating in a historic 9-0 unanimous victory over Australia in the finals. The team's journey was nothing short of remarkable:

- Preliminary Rounds: Won 7 out of 8 debates, securing victories against England, Scotland, Sri Lanka, Estonia, and a notable 3-0 win over Pakistan.
- Octofinals: Defeated New Zealand 5-0
- Quarterfinals: Defeated Bangladesh 5-0
- Semifinals: Overcame Hong Kong in a nail-biting 4-3 decision
- Finals: Triumphed over Australia 9-0 in a resounding win

The WSDC is the world's most prestigious and competitive school-level debating tournament, with over 60 nations participating, each represented by their top five debaters. This year's championship showcased unmatched intellect, critical thinking, and eloquence from young minds across the globe.



11th Oldham Cup Debate, Singapore



Talented debaters, Avni Kaur Chadha of Class-XII and Manveer Pratap Rathore of Class-X, have made the nation proud by securing the Runner-up position at the 11th Oldham Cup, held in Singapore. Representing Team India, Avni and Manveer were part of the five-member national contingent at this prestigious international debate tournament, organized by Anglo-Chinese Junior College. Meaning unfolds through pacing, symbolism, and carefully structured imagery, inviting viewers to interpret the narrative through experience rather than exposition.

Concept and Creative Approach

At its core, *The Transmission* reflects on systems that operate silently yet powerfully — transmitting data, influence, and control without being overtly observed. The theme resonates across both technological and social landscapes.

Developed with a minimal-dialogue philosophy, the film emphasizes:

- Visual pacing
- Symbolic framing
- Controlled rhythm
- Intentional restraint

Every frame is purposeful. There are no ornamental elements — each creative decision reinforces structure and meaning.

Agresh's accomplishment is a testament to his innovation, technical skill, and artistic vision. His global recognition at such a young age marks a proud milestone and showcases the power of youthful creativity on the international stage.

Earlier, the same team, while in Class VIII, brought great honour to the school by securing First Position in the Macmillan Budding Scientist Competition at IIT Bombay. 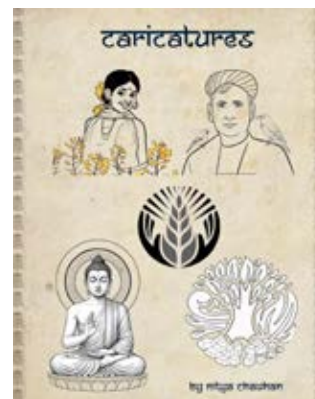

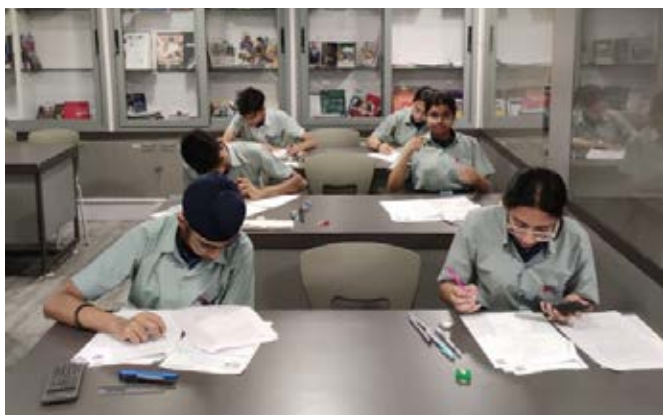


Campus Connect
